Biography:

Dr. Krugliak Cleveland is an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Univeristy of Chicago's Section of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition. She is an expert in inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) and the director of the intestinal ultrasound program at the University of Chicago. Dr. Krugliak Cleveland has been a leader in dissemination of intestinal ultrasound in North America. She is the cofounder of the Intestinal Ultrasound Group of the United States and Canada (iUSCAN) and an active committee member of the International Bowel Ultrasound Group (IBUS).

Her research focuses on application of new technology for the detection and prevention of complications of IBD including neoplasia and ulcerative colitis as a progressive and transmural disease. Her original scholarship has been published in Gastroenterology, The American Journal of Gastroenterology, Inflammatory Bowel Diseases, Clinical Gastroenterology and Hepatology, Digestive Diseases and Sciences.
