<p>Prof. Fernando Magro is a consultant in Gastroenterology and Director of the Clinical Pharmacology Unit, at the São João University Hospital in Porto, Portugal.</p> <p>He's a founder, board member, and research head of the Portuguese IBD Study Group (GEDII).</p> <p>He's an associate professor with tenure at the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Porto (FMUP), involved in two course units of the Masters in Medicine academic program and supervises or co-supervises Master and PhD students. Acting as a PhD supervisor, 15 students have already earned their degrees.</p> <p>Internationally, he was recently appointed President-Elect of the European Crohn's and Colitis Organization (ECCO). He also serves as Associate Editor of the United European Gastroenterology Journal (UEGJ) and as a member of the International Organization for the Study of Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IOIBD).</p>		
Research Field		
<p>Since 1995, his interest lies in Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) and intestinal epithelial inflammation. With his colleagues at GEDII and FMUP, he has developed several studies correlating drug levels to new serum and fecal biomarkers.</p> <p>Prof. Magro has published over 400 manuscripts and has more than 23,000 citations. He has received several research grants and acted as the principal investigator in various projects.</p> <p>He also acted as national coordinator for seven global clinical trials in IBD.</p> <p>His ultimate aim is to improve patients' quality of life through translational research and decision-making processes supported by the highest scientific evidence level.</p>
